- Interest in experimental research methods as well as quantitative and qualitative work in the fields of health policy evaluation or political sciences
- Excellent knowledge of German and English (spoken and written)
- Strong analytical skills as well as structured and responsible working method
- Excellent communication and rhetorical skills
- Ability to work in a team

The candidate can expect to work in a challenging position with unique possibility for research in an interdisciplinary team. During the project, the candidate will have the opportunity to build his own network with other researchers and stakeholders from the field of health care and health policy.
